

Our School's Uniform

We appreciate that our students observe the dress code well and wear correct school uniform, taking pride in their personal appearance. The full uniform is to be worn by students on the way to school, between lessons and on the way home.



- Black blazer with embroidered school badge.
- · Plain white shirt (tucked in).
- School tie with badge.
- V-necked, burgundy sweater with school badge (optional)
- Black trousers or knee length, black school skirt.
- Plain black socks or plain, opaque black tights.
- Black, polishable, traditional school-type shoes with distinguishable heel (not flat shoes).
- Hair styles should not be shaven or extreme and hair colouring should be restricted to one natural colour.
- Jewellery: a wristwatch can be worn; one set of small stud earrings in ear lobes (for safety reasons, no facial or body piercings).
- No false/acrylic nails.
- Plain black jackets not to be worn in school buildings.


- Red gym t-shirt with Newman logo




Homework continues to be set through ClassCharts for all subjects. Please check Classcharts with your son daughter, as work is set weekly for every subject.

Students who wear incorrect footwear are provided with alternative, 'school-issued' footwear for the day.


BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING

 One Hour ASD; Parents informed.


CONDUCT LEVELS

At each conduct level, we offer different levels of intervention and assistance to support our pupils with their behaviour and ensuring they can settle and get on with learning in the classroom.


SCHOOL LUNCHES
